President's Letter JEFF HARKMAN (President)

Now more than ever, we need your support!

The past year has been quite a year for Pleasant Lake. While we have successfully avoided the threat of aquatic invasive species for several years, we unfortunately were hit with two new species.

In August of 2017, Eurasian Water Milfoil was discovered near the public landing in the City of Annandale. The board took

immediate action and treated with a chemical agent to eradicate what we could. We continued treatments this past summer, and will continue to do so on an annual basis.

In August of 2018, we were alerted to what many of us had feared. Starry Stonewort was discovered at the Wright County public landing. Upon notification by the DNR, the PLIA Board immediately met and put together an aggressive action plan.

AIS Update KEVIN BERGSTROM (Vice President)

We currently have three invasive species in Pleasant Lake - Curly Leaf Pondweed (CLP), Eurasian Watermilfoil (EWM), and Starry Stonewort (SSW). All three produce dense mats at the water's surface affecting native species and animals. They will not be eradicated, and will require management each and every year.

Our projected cost for AIS treatments in 2019 is \$26,000. With potential grants from Wright County and the DNR, the net cost should be \$18,000.



Curly Leaf Pondweed is located all over the lake and covers about 128 acres. We treated

15 acres this year. CLP is spread by the transfer of plant fragments.



Eurasian Watermilfoil is in about 1-5 acres located just west of the city landing. We treated one acre early

in the summer and repeated the treatment of the same area in late summer because it was found again in the same area. It was treated with a potentially more effective granular chemical. A couple of plants were also found in the NW corner of the lake and we will check that area next summer to address, if needed. EWM is spread by the transfer of plant fragments.



Starry Stonewort

is in less than one acre located right off the Wright County boat landing on the NE end

of the lake. SSW is spread by the transfer of bulbils (star-like structures – see picture of actual SSW harvested from Pleasant Lake).

The plan included a two phased approach. Phase one utilized divers actually hand pulling the Starry Stonewort from the identified areas. Phase two included treatment with a copper-based algaecide. These two treatment alternatives have been utilized at Lake Sylvia and proven to be an effective management plan.

We now face the reality that this becomes an ongoing management issue. Unfortunately, it is not possible to completely eradicate these invasive species once you have them. We must manage them to the best of our ability and treat them annually to keep them at bay.

In order to do this, the PLIA has put together our 2019 budget which includes several new expenditure items we have not had to historically incur. They include:

- Incremental lake surveys to monitor status of invasive species
- Divers to hand pull Starry Stonewort
- Copper-based algaecide treatments

The PLIA Board is working to identify DNR and Wright County grants to curb some of this incremental expense, however, the reality is these will only offset a small percentage of our increased expenses.

Pleasant Lake is a wonderful asset for all property owners, as well as the entire community. It needs to be managed and protected for the future enjoyment by all.

Approximately one year ago, the PLIA launched an aggressive fundraising campaign to allow us to deal with the threat of invasive species. The threat is now real, and now more than ever we need your support!
