Invasive Update

KEVIN BERGSTROM (Vice President)

This year we will once again be treating the three invasive species in Pleasant Lake.

Starry Stonewort: Treatment will involve having a contractor do a dive survey and pull any plants at the county landing, followed by a chemical treatment. This treatment will be repeated over the summer dependent on the results of the surveys. A dive survey will also be done by the city landing.

Eurasian Watermilfoil: Once again, treatment for EWM will involve surveys and application of a chemical treatment in designated areas as found in the surveys.

Curlyleaf Pondweed: A lake survey will be done early in the summer followed by a chemical treatment.

Why does PLIA have so many surveys done? It is the most proactive way to identify any AIS in the lake and gives us the ability to focus treatments.

Did you know...

- Wright County Swappers Meet was established in 1970 by Stanley and Gladys
 Miller
- The first meet in 1970 had about 5 vendors. Now there is an average of 250 vendors in the summer, even more on holiday weekends!
- In 1970, the booth fee was \$2 or an equivalent trade or barter.
- Vendors come from all over the United States including California, Texas and Pennsylvania.
- It is the largest swap meet in Minnesota.
- Wright County Swappers Meet was voted WCCO's best Flea Market in Minnesota in 2014.
- It began as family owned, and is STILL family owned, now run by Kevin and Laurie Miller – along with many other family members participating in various ways.
- Their goal is for the Swappers Meet to be free to the community forever, so everyone can have fun, enjoy summer, and see their neighbors.
