Our annual operating budget has needed to increase from a modest \$5000 in the early years to \$38,000 in 2021.

I am proud of the work the PLIA has done and the success we have had in aggressively managing AIS in Pleasant Lake.

It has been an honor to serve on the board and I personally would like to "Thank" our board members and lake membership for their ongoing support and contributions. This work has been critical in ensuring we keep Pleasant Lake a gem for the entire community to enjoy!

## October Update On Membership and AIS Donations

First the good news: 75% of our eligible members have paid the \$50 annual dues for 2021. That's only 3 short of our budgeted \$5,000 from 100 members. Thanks to all who have paid your 2021 dues.

On our Water Quality/AIS Fundraising, thanks to the generosity of 58% of our members, we have raised \$12,518 or 50% of our \$25,000 2021 goal. A generous contribution from the City of Annandale brings us to 70% of our goal – still far short 100%. Please think of the PLIA as you plan for donations during the remainder of 2021 and remember we have an IRS 501 (c)(3) designation as a non-profit organization.

Are you aware that the 2021 tax regulations allow deductible cash donations of up to \$600 (married filing a joint return) even though you don't itemize? Please consider the PLIA.

Also, if you need to make an RMD from your IRA in 2021, consider a Qualified Charitable Contribution (QCD) to the PLIA. It's win-win for both the donor and the PLIA! Check with your tax advisor to make sure you do it correctly.

## Pleasant Lake Invasive Update

Starry Stonewort (SSW): In 2021 the PLIA contracted dives looking for SSW on the county landing 5 times. During these dives it was found only once, amounting to less than a handful, which was then manually harvested, and the area treated with Cutrine Plus. A dive was also done at the city landing, and none was found.

Overall, we have reduced the amount of SSW on the county landing. Steve McComas, from Blue Water Science, stated after two divers checked the county landing in October, that if there is any SSW, it is very sparse. We will repeat the same plan next year.

Eurasian Watermilfoil (EWM): This summer the PLIA had multiple surveys done. No EWM was found for the second year. We will continue to do these surveys, and treat if found.

Curlyleaf Pondweed (CLP): We had a delineation survey completed and a chemical treatment applied to a total of 20 acres by the city landing, the county landing, and the west end of the lake. This was an increase from 15 acres in past years to 20 acres this year. The PLIA plans on treating 20 acres next year.

**Zebra Mussels:** We will continue to monitor the effect on the lake. More zebras were found during the whole lake survey and we could start to see more in the coming seasons.

Finally, the PLIA had a whole lake survey completed in October to look for any new areas of invasive species and treat them. No new AIS were found during this survey.

Note: Every year the PLIA applies for DNR grant money to help pay for treatments. This year we did not receive any as the funds were distributed by a lottery system. This makes your AIS donation even more important! Thank you!
