INVASIVE Starry stonewort

KEYS TO ID

- Long, smooth branchlets are attached in whorls of 5 8
- · Small, star-shaped bulbils form on clear threads at base of plant
- and may be found above or below the sediment surface
- Small, orange spheres called antheridia may be visible, these are male reproductive structures
- Typical branchlets are long; can be up to twelve inches
- · Can form dense mats in water

LOOKS SIMILAR TO

- Native Chara (native)
- Native Nitella (native)
- Sago pondweed (native)
- Water stargrass (native)

WHERE TO LOOK • In shallow, still water and near accesses



Starry Stonewort (SSW) Is in 25 Lakes in Minnesota






SSW Starts Out in a Small Area Typically at a Public Access




SSW Has Potential to Spread Throughout the Lake

Lake Koronis (2,968 acres)




2015: 217 acres (first observed)

Can SSW Be Contained If Found Early?

In 4 lakes, SSW was initially found with light to moderate growth at the public accesses


- Grand (1 ac removal)
- Pleasant (0.5 ac treatment)
- Rice (0.6 ac expanded to 12.8 ac, reduced to 4.6 ac)
- Sylvia (0.5 ac expanded to 1.7 ac)






Pleasant Lake SSW

Examples of SSW Regrowth Found After Copper Treatments








Examples of SSW Hand Removal at Accesses







To Eliminate SSW from an **Access Will** be Challenging **Bulbils Can Be Plentiful**



SSW Findings Through 2022 (1 of 2)

- Hand removal, chemical applications, or both have kept small SSW infestations from spreading throughout the 4 lakes.
- SSW has been contained in a public access area in Pleasant Lake for 5 years, but SSW has not been eliminated.
- Multiple annual treatments are a factor to contain the spread.
 First treatments have been in late June or July. However, new growth continues through the summer months.

SSW Findings Through 2022 (2 of 2)

- Barriers have not been used for chemical treatments.
- Chemical applications may control nearly all above ground SSW, but bulbils in sediments are likely resistant to chemical treatments.
- Hand removal may remove rhizoids and bubils, but is not likely to remove 100% of the SSW biomass
- Hand removal followed by a copper treatment is a good control option. Early detection is the key to containment.

- Curly-leaf Pondweed Treated 40 acres
- Eurasian Water Milfoil
 - Not found last year, will check in August/September
- Starry Stonewart Treated 1 acre
 - Divers surveyed, harvested, and Mizzen application at County landing
 - Early July 3 locations but very small amount
 - Monthly check on County landing
 - Will do a survey and dive on both landings in September
- Zebra Mussels
 - Hopefully are approaching a "peak"
- Whole lake survey in September
 - Will concentrate on Eurasian Water Milfoil and Starry Stonewart
